Sat, Sept 19: Competitors package (sign-in forms, laminated name tags, maps of the venues, official programme, goodie bags, local merchant's coupons, etc...) available for pick up at the official competition hotel/head-quarters. This will allow the tracking of which competitors and teams have arrived, and to co-ordinate an introduction between any competitors that arrive as individuals wishing form a team with other individuals. Monday, Sept 21: First official practice day (competition boats to be available at the lake for the official practice days. Competitors will alternate between venues and apply for a time-slot for the boats to allow equal access and to avoid conflicts. Controllers and judges are not required for practice sessions)

Tuesday, Sept 22: Second official practice day (competitors will again alternate between venues and apply for a time-slot for the boats to allow equal access and to avoid conflicts)

Wednesday, Sept 23: No fishing on competition waters. This day is typically used for team strategy meetings, fly tying and general preparation for competitors, volunteers and organizers.

- 12pm: Training for volunteers, controllers and sector judges (FFC representatives will be present to help with clarification and questions concerning the rules and procedures).
- 2pm: Captain's meeting for the drawing of groups and beats and to discuss the rules of this competition and any modifications to the rules.
- 5pm: Organizing Committee's 'meet & greet' BBQ for competitors and volunteers, team photos, and opening ceremonies

Thursday, Sept 24: First day of competition - sessions 1 and 2 (morning and afternoon sessions)

Friday, Sept 25: Second day of competition - sessions 3 and 4 (morning and afternoon sessions)

Saturday, Sept 26: Last day of competition - session 5 (morning session only).

3pm to 5pm: Conservation Symposium. 6pm: Closing banquet and awards ceremony and FFC auction. More info check out the website at: <u>http://www.flyfishingcanada.net</u>



This photo shows the new Agri-Green Biodiesel cardlock pump in Fernie. The Fernie **Agri-Green Biodiesel** cardlock is now open for business 24/7 at 1592 9th Avenue in Fernie. Owners Gary and Lila Tomlinson expanded their company to include the new cardlock pump conveniently located in front of the Car Wash across from McDonalds. Agri-Green Biodiesel began in 2005 and employs 2 people. Gary says: "*The facility currently offers B5 biodiesel, a blend of 95% diesel and 5% biodiesel which is derived from renewable sources such as canola, soy and animal fats. In an effort to give back to the community, Agri-Green Biodiesel will be donating 1/2 cent per litre to local charities and schools of the customer's choosing. We believe in Fernie."*

The current economy represents a major challenge for many as businesses and employees suffer through significant change. Through it all we have many reasons to remain positive and confident. A year from now Fernie will still be a strong community with a strong and diverse economic base, and hopefully we'll be looking back on this recession.

It's helpful to compare what we're going through now, with what we've gone through before.

 The Bank of Canada predicts that Canada's GDP will shrink by up to 1.2%. In 1982 if fell by 3.2% and in 1991 by 1.8%. Even with the increased spending recently announced in the Federal Budget, Canada's debt-to-GDP ration will rise only 28%, the lowest level in the G7 group of industrialized countries.

- TD Economics is predicting the 2009 national unemployment rate to range from 7.7% to 8.9%. In both 1983 and 1991 it was 11%.
- Interest rates on mortgages have fallen dramatically.
- Gasoline prices have fallen.
- The Federal Budget is pumping billions of dollars in stimulus initiatives, including millions into the local economy.

We've had recessions before and most good companies emerge stronger, so *think positive!*
