The Waldo Stockbreeders' Association was formed in 1939 by a group of local ranchers and residents. The original focus was on wild horses and a growing sheep/cattle conflict. The initial push was by Jack Aye from Jaffray, B.C., and Jack McDonald from Grasmere, B.C.

The organization's boundaries grew and expanded to include the South Country, Elk Valley, Baynes Lake, and the Elko Auction Yards, followed by the Cranbrook and Wycliffe areas.

The Stockbreeders' Association was very active in the events before and after the Libby Dam flooding.

Through this project, the Stockbreeders' history and the place of farming and ranching in the rural and economic life of East Kootenay will come to life. The information will be assembled as a feature page exhibit on the CBIRH website and as a series on CBIRH's YouTube channel, linked through the website.

Safe with 4-H is a one-day family event focussed on making home and farm life safer and healthier for all children and their families through education and training. Education and training for 2021 will include ATV safety, Emergency Preparedness, Fire Safety, Electricity Safety, safety around equipment, safe animal handling, etc. The day is broken into 2 parts: 1. Safety Presentation (ATV Safety and Helmet Fitting); and, 2. Safety Circuit - a variety of safety learning stations with hands-on activities (try a fire extinguisher, build a first aid kit, vision impairment obstacle course). Safe with 4-H requires a number of volunteers (approx. 20-30) to assist with presentations, leading safety circuit activities, fitting the helmets and signing in and handing out Safe with 4-H t-shirts.

Critical Incident Stress Management is a group and/or individual technique: defusing or debriefing, used after a critical incident or traumatic event, facilitated by trained volunteers. It is used to minimize the emotional and potentially psychological impact of that event and speed the normal recovery of people who have been exposed to an abnormal event. Where very large numbers of people are effected a Crisis Management Briefing is provided. Training for team members and general public with an interest in Stress Management is also organized and provided depending upon availability of trainers and numbers interested.

#### Kootenay East Youth Soccer Association

Cranbrook Indoor Sports Facility Vehicle Airlock

The vehicle airlock is a much needed component of the Cranbrook Indoor Sports Facility. The main component, the airdome, has been installed and is operational and KEYSA is now working towards completion of the facility as a whole. The vehicle airlock will allow vehicles and other large objects to move in/out of the facility for various reasons including loading in/out for conventions, tradeshows, concerts, and transporting equipment. Use of the airlock will also be required for large equipment and materials to enter the facility for any repairs, replacement of dome components or turf. Lastly, the airlock can provide valuable storage when not in use.

The airlock system allows the dome to maintain positive pressure whenever something large enters/exits the facility over a longer period of time. It involves a 2-door system that allows larger objects to be safely and slowly placed inside the lock, the lock closed, and the interior door opened, allowing passage without ever having the inside of the dome exposed to the exterior. This larger entrance provides invaluable access for potential rentals as well as the multiple dedicated user groups that need to bring equipment in and out of the indoor sports facility.

Working with the dome suppliers, the Farley Group, as well as local door installers and electricians, KEYSA will oversee the management of this project.

#### Senior Citizens Club of Fernie & District

Seniors Centre Window Covering Project

The Fernie Seniors Drop-In Centre is a heavily used community asset. The facility was opened in 1984 and although the Society, in conjunction with the City of Fernie, have maintained it to excellent standards the interior window coverings are in need of replacement. In December 2020 we replaced the windows at the Centre to triple-pane, commercial grade windows in order to increase energy efficiency and decrease heating and cooling costs. In order to maximize these benefits we are now seeking to replace our current window blinds with new Hunter Douglas vertical blinds that will further increase facility efficiency.

We are seeking assistance to change out all interior window coverings to increase energy efficiency and ensure facility maintenance and sustainability. We are fortunate to have spectacular views thanks to our numerous and very tall windows. The size and number of windows allow for appreciation of our natural surroundings but it also means that the facility does experience heat loss and gain, even with upgraded and efficient windows. As much as 30% of a buildings heating and cooling energy can be lost through its windows. An upgraded blind system would allow us to better control solar heat, create better insulation, and further maximize energy cost savings.

New window coverings would allow for greater energy efficiency, decreased utility costs, and create a comfortable environment for facility users and members.

#### Wildsight Elk Valley Branch

"Protecting Stories in Stone" - A Conservation Plan for the Fernie Ammonite

Considered one of the largest ammonite fossils in Canada, the Fernie Ammonite (Titanites occidentalis) preserves the remains of a 1.4 m carnivorous cephalopod that lived and died in a shallow sea some 150 million years ago. Located up Coal Creek, locals have visited the fossil for decades. With social media, trail apps, instagram, etc. the location of the fossil is well known. There needs to be an identified parking area safe for visitors out of the way of industrial traffic (e.g. logging trucks), designated signed hiking trail to ensure safe access, along with persuasive text on 3 interpretive signs to inform visitors of the significance of the fossil and encourage conservation of this unique, nationally significant fossil specimen.
