Argenta	Argenta Community Association	Argenta Playground	Repair and relocate existing playground infrastructure and key elements such as swings, obstacles and geodesic domes, increasing usability for a broader age range and making the playground functional year-round.	\$57,000
Beaver Valley	Regional District of Kootenay Boundary	Beaver Valley Pickleball Court	Create new pickleball courts at Beaver Valley Family Park.	\$34,500
Canyon	Canyon Community Association	Canyon Community Park Playground	Replace an aged playground with an adventure playground, including an off-season accessible pit toilet and various upgrades to outdoor amenities.	\$22,500
Elkford	District of Elkford	Elkford Courts	Resurface the tennis courts and make upgrades to allow for multi-sport use.	\$75,000
Elkford	District of Elkford	Elkford Bike and Skills Park	Provide a space for bicycles, scooters, rollerblades, skateboards and other equipment by re-grading, removing trees, shaping the earth for jumps, placing natural rock features for balance/navigation and grading/paving the pump track area.	\$250,000
Golden	Town of Golden	Golden Freeride Park	Expand the skate park, enhancing it for a broader range of demographics, skill levels and wheeled users.	\$151,500
Johnsons Landing	Johnsons Landing Community Association	Johnsons Landing Hall Playground	Expand and improve the existing natural playground area by adding interesting and engaging features such as kinetic play structures, a basket swing, a climbing net and a balance beam.	\$12,500
Kaslo	Kaslo Baseball and Softball Association	Kaslo Baseball and Softball Field Fencing	Fence the existing ball diamond at Murray Pearson Memorial Ball Park to provide a safer environment for players and neighbours.	\$11,250
Kaslo	Kaslo Outdoor Recreation and Trails Society	All Yew Need Disc Golf	Enhance an existing popular disc golf course by adding permanent target baskets, tee boxes and signage.	\$15,000

Kimberley	City of Kimberley	Swan Avenue Park Adventure Playground	Create an inclusive, accessible and intergenerational adventure park with a zip line, climbing structures, nature exploration, a picnic space, pathways and a gazebo.	\$99,000
Nakusp	Nakusp and Area Bike Society	Nakusp Pump Track and Skills Park	Expand the bike skills park at Mt. Abriel Recreation Area by constructing a 200- to 300-metre dirt pump track, a mulch jump and technical features.	\$35,500
Nakusp	Village of Nakusp	Nakusp Natural Adventure Park Phase Two	Build the second phase of a natural adventure playground that will comprise play elements for children aged 18 months to 12 years.	\$180,000
New Denver	Village of New Denver	New Denver All-wheels Park	Create an outdoor, multi-use recreational facility to allow riders of all ages and abilities to lap their bikes, adaptive wheelchairs, scooters and skateboards around an asphalt-capped pump-track course and terrain features.	\$120,000
Salmo	Regional District of Central Kootenay	Salmo Outdoor Pool	Support phase one, including replacing heating and sanitization equipment and the mechanical room.	\$150,000
Slocan	Village of Slocan	Village of Slocan Multi- sport Court	Create an accessible multi-sport court that will revitalize a well-used, aged, fractured concrete surface for activities like pickleball, basketball, tennis, ball hockey and ice hockey.	\$208,500
Slocan Park	Slocan Park Community Hall Society	Slocan Park Community Hall Development	Upgrade the multi-purpose sports field by levelling the outfield and acquiring an ice rink liner.	\$19,000
Trail	City of Trail	Reg Stone (Tadanac) Playground	Replace the current pea gravel surface with a rubberized surface to enhance safety.	\$25,000
Warfield	Village of Warfield	Warfield Disc Golf Course	Design and build a nine-hole disc golf course to allow residents of all ages to participate in an outdoor activity within their own community.	\$6,800 <b>\$1,473,050</b>
